

Guideline for Saar Case Notes

The following guideline is designed to support the drafting of a Case Note. It outlines a possible structure and key points to consider but allows authors the flexibility to adjust the format as needed.

Formal Guidelines

- **Word Limit:** Case Notes should not exceed 1,250 words. Longer analyses can be submitted under the “Saar Briefs” category.
- **Referencing:** After introducing the case, refer directly to relevant paragraphs in the decision in brackets (e.g., “para. XY”).
- While optional, integrating secondary literature can enhance the analysis and evaluation of the judgment.
- If using a hierarchical structure, follow the numbering style: A. – I. – 1. – a) – aa) – (1) – (a).
- Write clearly and precisely, explaining specialized terminology where necessary.

Suggested Structure for a Saar Case Note

This framework aims to provide clarity and structure to your Case Note while offering flexibility to address the unique aspects of each case.

1. Title

- Clearly identify the decision to provide context to the reader.

2. Introduction

- Specify the judgment being analyzed (court, date, case number).
- Highlight the decision's significance and relevance.

3. Facts of the Case

- Focus on the key circumstances relevant to the legal analysis.
- Identify factual elements and arguments presented by the parties that are particularly important.

4. Procedural Background

- Detail any prior rulings from lower courts or related proceedings

- Emphasize certain aspects that played a significant role in the case.

5. Key Findings of the Judgment

- Summarize the court's reasoning and the key points of the decision.
- Highlight significant statements or quotes that capture the essence of the ruling.

6. Analysis and Evaluation

- *Continuity or Change*: Does the judgment uphold or break with established case law?
- *Practical Impact*: What are the practical implications of the decision? Does it affect specific legal fields, institutions, or broader societal concerns?
- *Legal Certainty*: Does the judgment clarify the law, or does it leave room for varying interpretations?
- *Comparative Context*: Are there parallels to other decisions from the same or different courts?
- *Political Implications*: What potential legal, political, or societal impacts might the ruling have?

7. Conclusion and Outlook

- Summarize the key takeaways and consider possible future developments stemming from the judgment.
